Rosemaling with Joan Dahl

Joan Dahl, a New Jersey native, married Norwegian born Thor Dahl in 1967. The Dahls moved to Florida and then onto California. In 1984, they found their way to Norway. During the 17 years spent in that country Joan became a master in the Rosemaling technique and actually taught at the Norwegian University for 9 years. They returned to the United States in 2001 and settled in Caribee Shores, Florida. Joan tells us, "I became completely fascinated by the art of Rosemaling after living in my husband Thor's homeland of Norway. Previous trips had planted some "seeds" of interest in my mind. The many trips to museums and old stave churches had open my eyes and heart to this over 1000 year old art form.

Before our move to Norway, we owned several gift stores in a very popular Scandinavian village in California called Solvang." As owner of Dahl Craft Art Centers in California, Joan got a chance to dabble with other artist and different mediums, which helped to round out her skills, teaching style and repertoire. She tells us that her biggest influence in developing a

successful teaching style was Priscilla Hauser. She goes on, "I started to decorate our businesses with Rosemaling designs. Other businesses in the village soon commissioned me to decorate their storefronts. The authentic medium for Rosemaling is oil, which allowed me to decorate the interiors, exteriors and shop signs."

Joan has studied this ancient technique from such masters as Vi Thode, Gary Albrecht, and Jackie Klokseth. She was most fortunate to take from and celebrate the 80th birthday of Master Oscar Kjetsaa of Telemark, Norway.

On the local scene, Joan's studio in Caribee Shores offers classes and supplies. Additionally, she offers online classes at her web site www.rosemal.com. Joan has authored three books, contributed to the Society of Decorative Painters bi-monthly publication, The Decorative Painter, and teaches at the Society of Decorative Painters annual convention.

Joan's choice for authentic Rosemaling work is Martin/F. Webers Professional Permalba Oils. Joan says, "I find the colors

to be very vibrant with excellent pigmentation. For my special Rosemaling palette, Professional Permalba Oils gives me perfect colors. I mix them from my own Rosemaling formulas; furthermore, I really enjoy painting with the Permalba creamy consistency."

Joan's outlook sees more travel teaching, and electronic classes via the Internet. A work in progress is her book on large furniture decoration. Her tips for teachers are: "Be secure in what you have created and what you are teaching. Do not play favorites with the students. Smile, be happy and toss in a bit of humor now and then."

The Reader's Column

Signature...do you know how important your signature is? Most people put more thought into the artwork than into signing it. Your signature will be visible as long as the works exist. Your signature is an expression of you, your personality and is in fact art itself. Furthermore, you own it and if it is copied, it is considered forgery.

Practice signing your name by writing it in various ways on tracing paper cutouts; try it large, small, printed, written, use your full name, just the last or even initials. Then lay the cutouts in different areas of the artwork. What looks best? Trust your instincts and when you decide, make it so! Try never to deviate.

Cute flowers, hearts, and other graphics are not suitable for fine art designs; however, these are acceptable for decorative pieces. The medium with which you inscribe the signature should match the surface and medium used to create the design. Pencil is the norm for watercolor, while pastels are usually signed with pastel, pencil, or ink.

Most are eventually sold; however, some remain keepers. Rescuing trashed items switches my artistic brain into overdrive. Finding a beautiful tray for a buck or a deteriorating door with peeling paint is a day well spent. I can hardly wait to get home and begin the cleaning process. I begin with sanding, if necessary, a good washing, if the surface will stand it, if not a gentle dusting and finally gluing or other means of repairing major damage. Then the creative process begins. For me, the possibilities seem endless.

For years, I created commission pieces of furniture and other décor for an Interior Designer. Tables, chairs, armoire's, serving trays of all sizes even fire place mantels can be a beautiful addition to any décor, given the correct art work treatment. My most recent find was a fireplace mantel with

a large, ornate mirror. My husband added legs to both ends. I applied a crackle finish to them, so they would match the mantle. Applying a bit of artist license, the completed piece is now a headboard for an antique bed! The family, who owned the mantel, had it around for twenty years. They just could not toss it out and had no idea what to do with it. After I worked my "Junk Yard" magic, they were thrilled, and now the bedroom is a must see in their home.

The next time you have a bit of free time, check out some of the flea market or junk stores in your area. Never underestimate the power of the artistic mind.
